Treatment Recommended For Bronchiolitis Specific Pathway

All children referred on the bronchiolitis pathway will be expected to meet the referral criteria and have no red flag signs. Patients will be reviewed on the observation unit or ward by a ST4 or above first, and then the referral progressed on to ACE if this has been approved by the On Call Consultant.
