The website is to help us recruit more members of our community to take part in healthcare research.

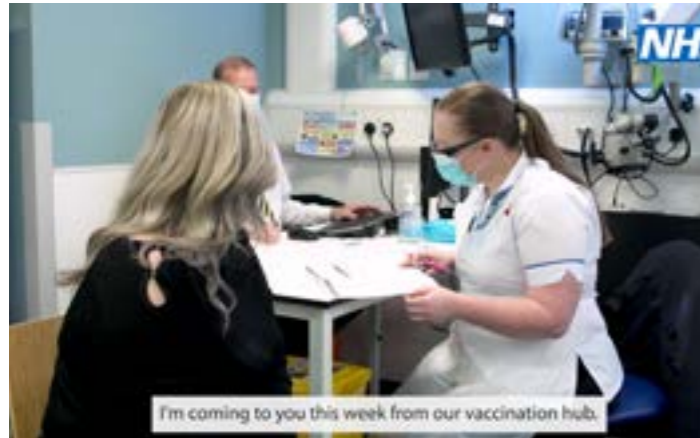

We hear from our ICU nurses who have been at the front line of our Covid -19 care at the trust.

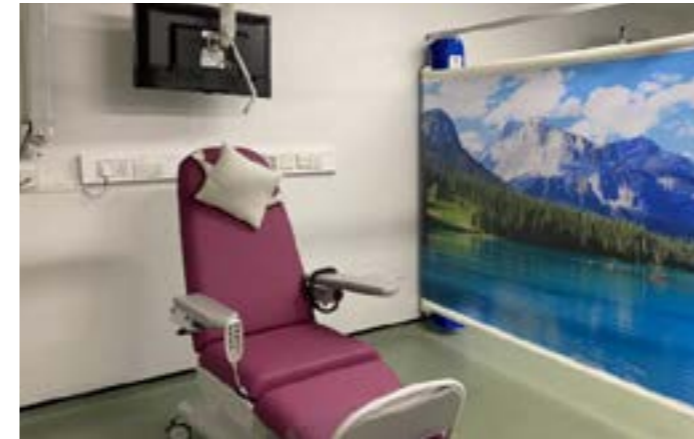
They are looking after themselves too and coming up with some great ideas to make sure the teams stay fit and well.
