


The Rule of Threes: three factors that triple the likelihood of families overriding first person consent for organ donation in the UK

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Minority ethnicity, non-involvement of the SNOD and donation type (circulatory death vs brainstem death) tripled the likelihood of families reversing their loved one's wish to donate their organs

SNOD data April- Sept 2021

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65 deaths audited; 23 referrals to organ donation team

No missed referrals. No missed opportunities. No late referrals.

One hospital approach; unavoidable.

Donation after circulatory death

- 21 referrals, none eligible

Donation after brainstem death

- 5 patients eligible - 100% brainstem testing rate - best practice
- 2 consented, 3 unsuitable/surgical declines

6-12 lives saved and improved through solid organ and tissue donation in past 6 months. Well done BTHFT!
