We've completely redesigned our hospital chaplaincy service to be more inclusive and represent the people we serve.

Our new service will now be known as SPaRC which stands for Spiritual, Pastoral and Religious Care.

SPaRC offers a service to anyone, regardless of race, religion, ethnicity or belief whether they are a patient or employee in one of the Trust's family of hospitals.

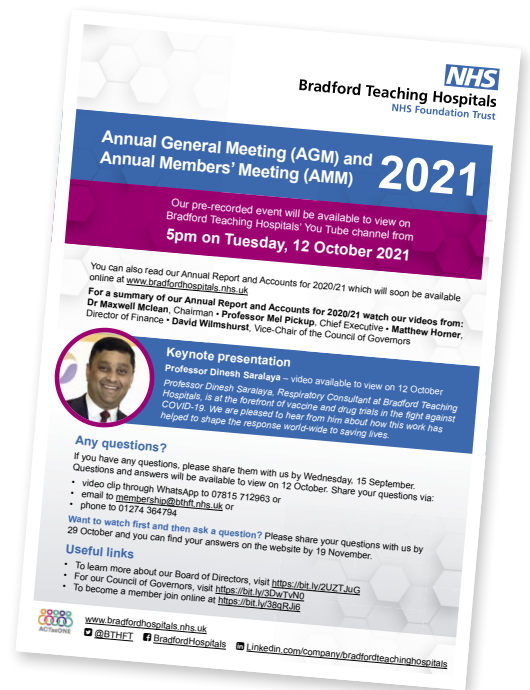

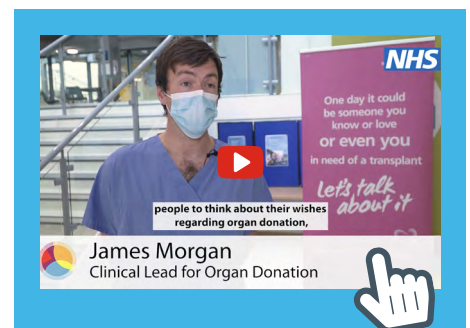
Virtual Royal Infirmary
