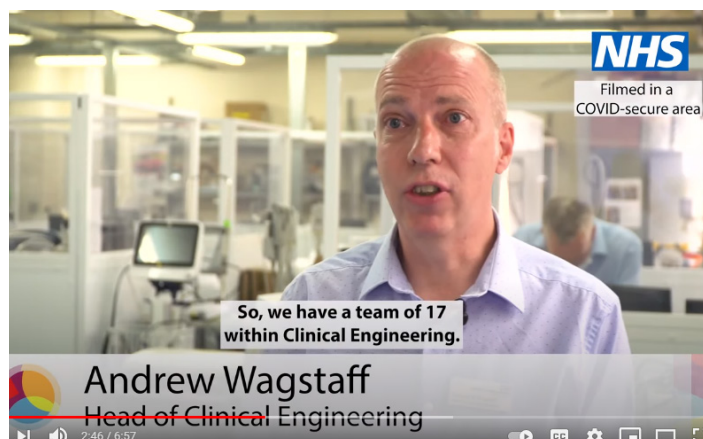

Midwives lead vaccine drive



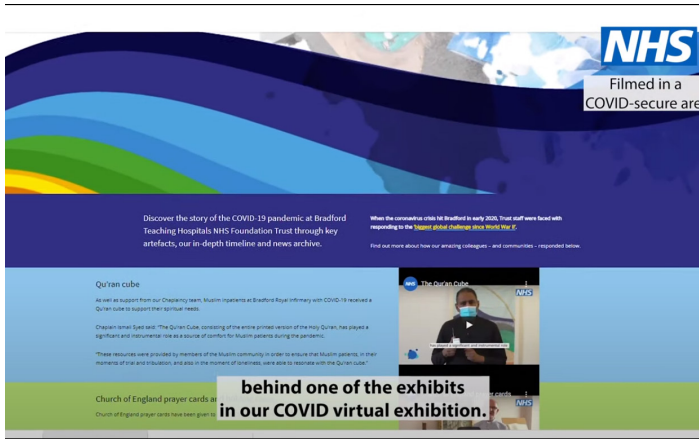
Mel Pickup is the Chief Executive Officer of Bradford Teaching Hospitals Foundation Trust.

We meet a member of our staff who enjoys fell running.



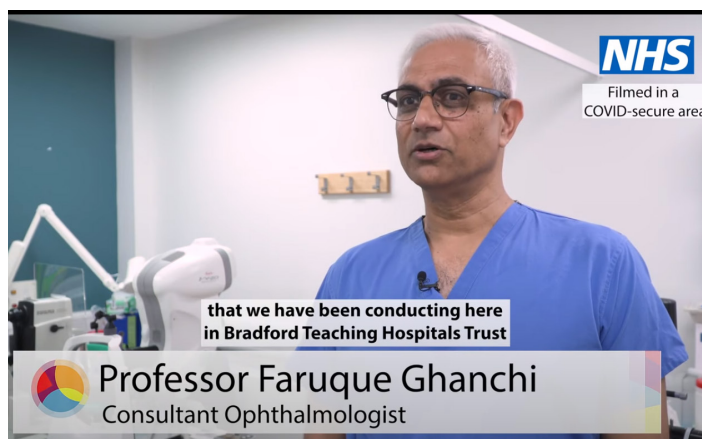

Our Bradford Hospitals' Charity is preparing to get a fantastic boost for our BIG Neonatal Appeal.

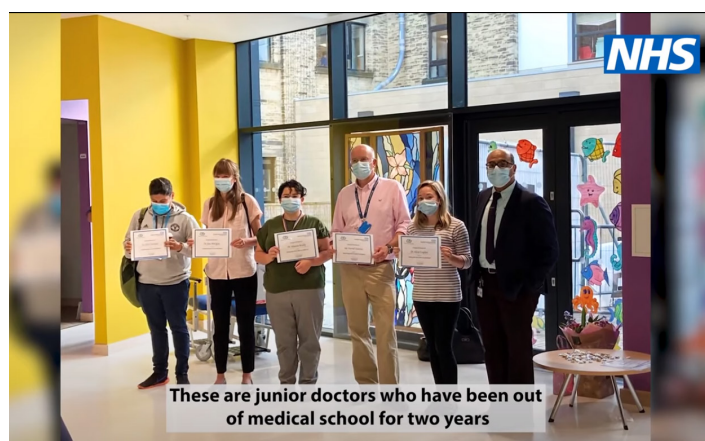

This week we say “hello and goodbye” to junior doctors at the Trust.

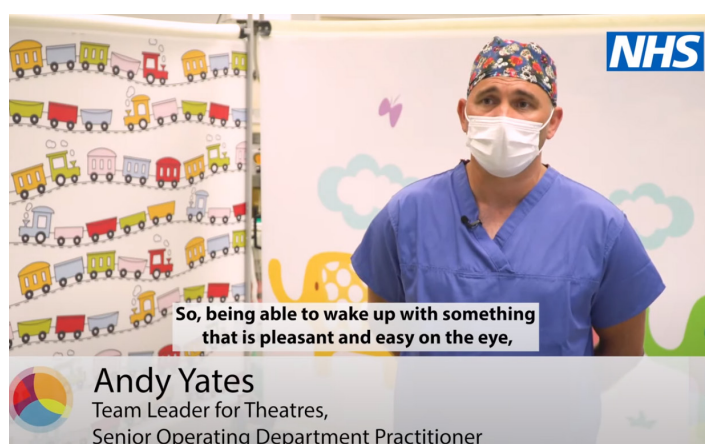
Some newly qualified doctors have joined us from medical school.

We also get a look at lovely, colourful new screens in our recovery room where we look after children who have just had an operation.

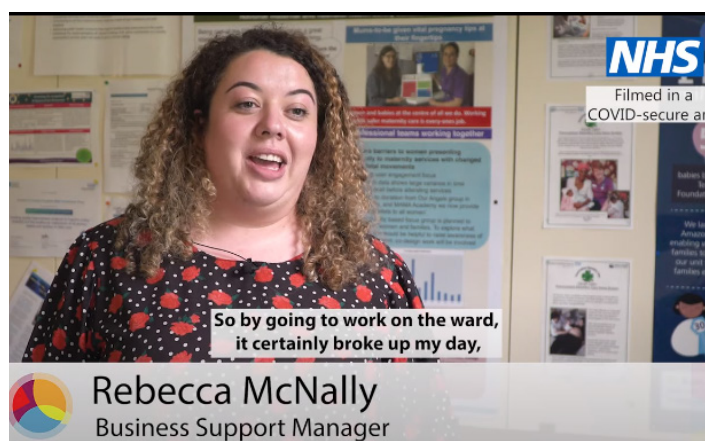

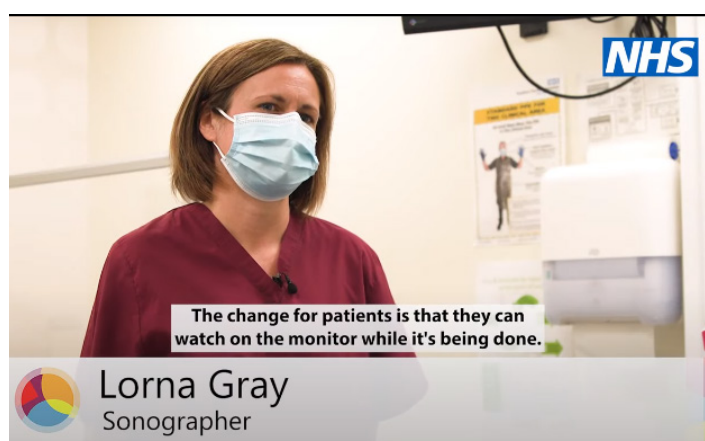


This week we hear about the launch of our Caring through COVID virtual exhibition.

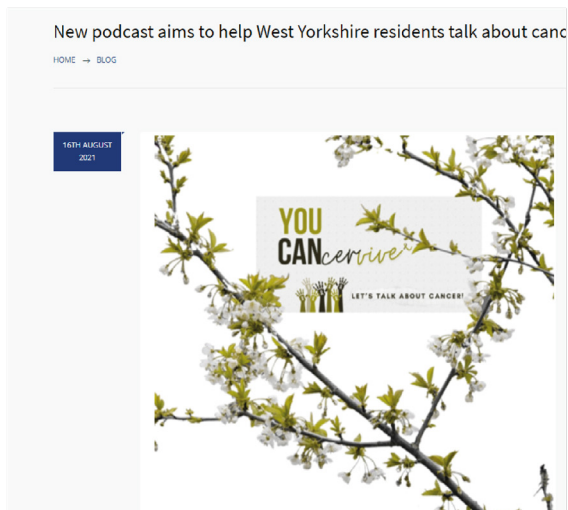


Our Born in Bradford (BiB) researchers want to hear from you.
