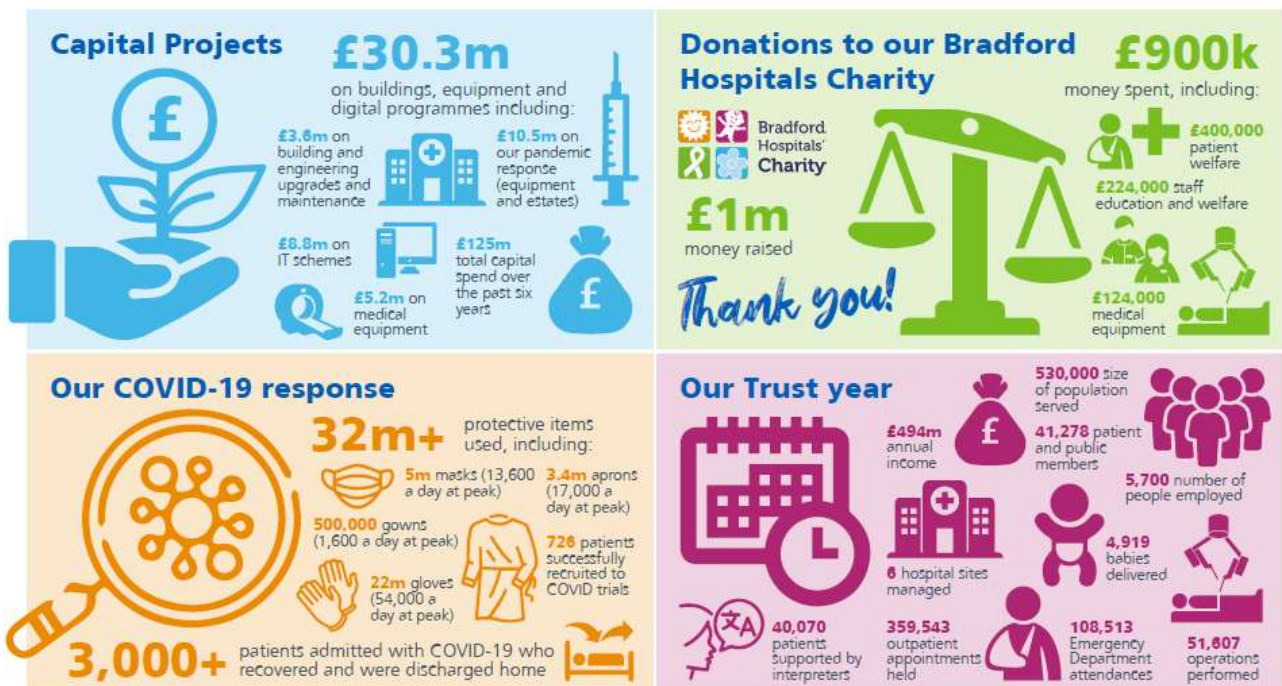

Our last Council of Governors meeting took place on 21 October 2021.

- Bradford South (1 seat)
- Staff Governor Nursing and Midwifery (1 seat)
- Staff Governor Medical and Dental (1 seat)
- Patient (1 seat)

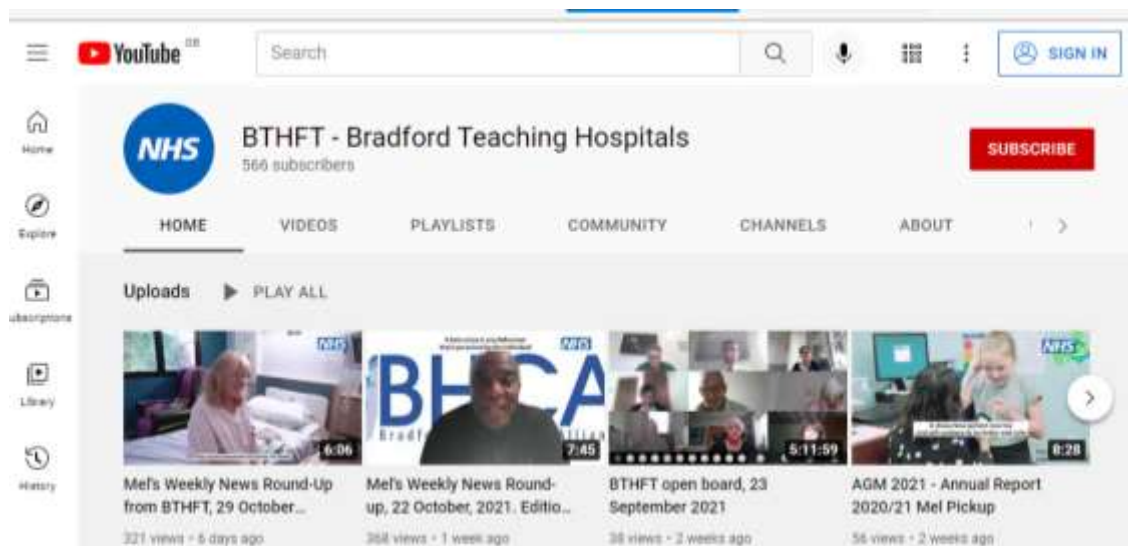
