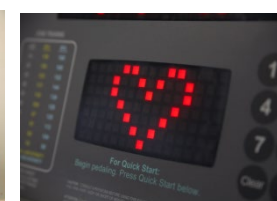
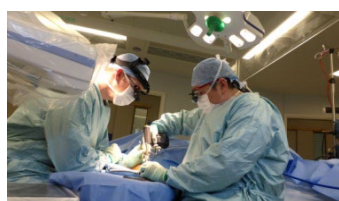


# Outstanding Neonatal Services



# Introduction

- The Outstanding Maternity Services programme (OMS) is extremely successful;
  - As part of the Trusts vision for an outstanding perinatal service, a similar process now needs to occur for the Neonatal Services.
- The Neonatal Unit (NNU)
  - 1 of 4 NICU in The Yorkshire and Humber Neonatal Critical Care Network
  - GIRFT data overall shows good quality of care but has identified challenges
  - Concerns with staffing, education and some quality aspects including infection
  - Vulnerable Bradford population with high proportion of Very Low Birth Weight infants

- To illustrate our vision for Bradford's journey to an Outstanding Neonatal Service

## Background

- Focus on people
  - Secure as a designated Neonatal ICU
  - National investment in staffing
  - Good recruitment
  - Appraisal of qualities and need
  - Review of cluster of 3 Serious Incidents and GIRFT data
- 5 key work-streams align with OMS
