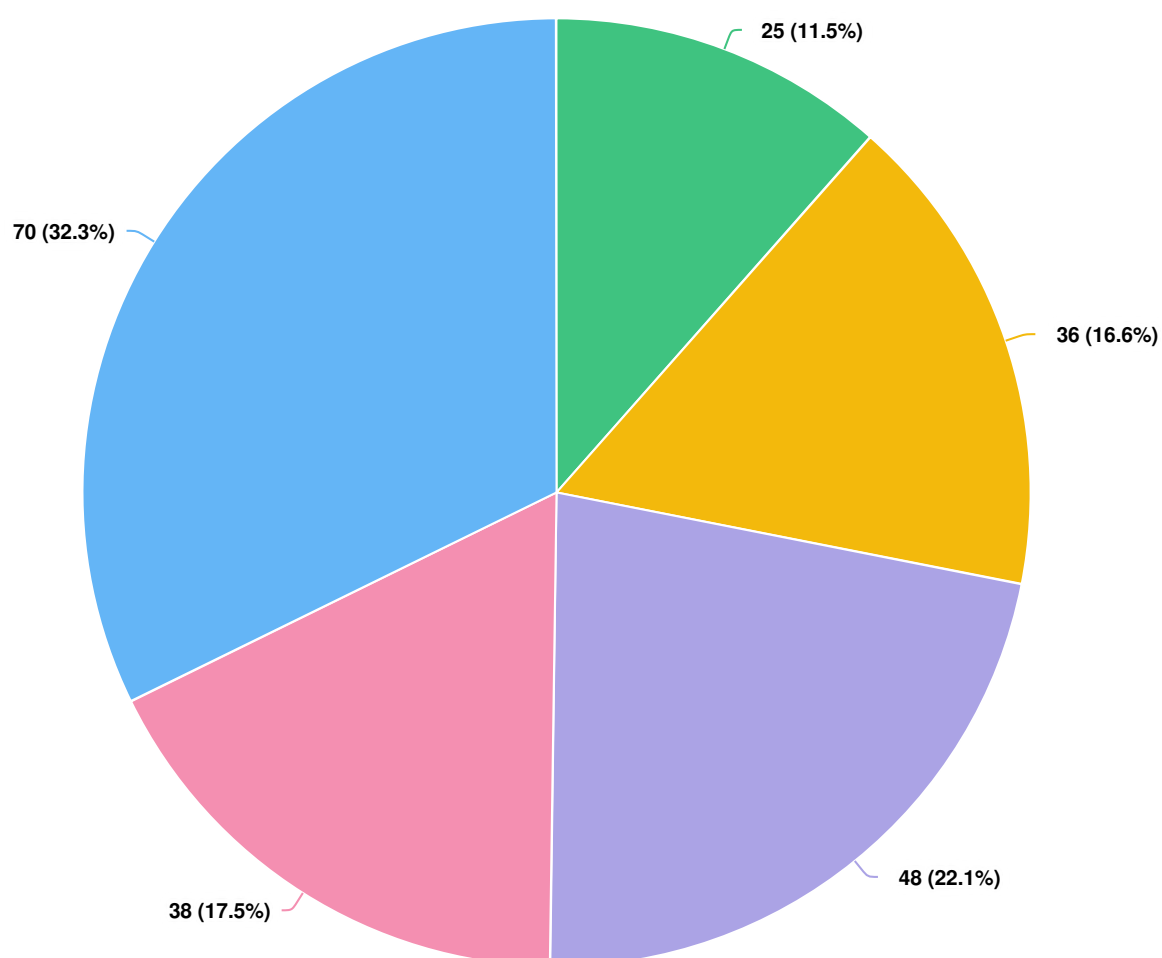

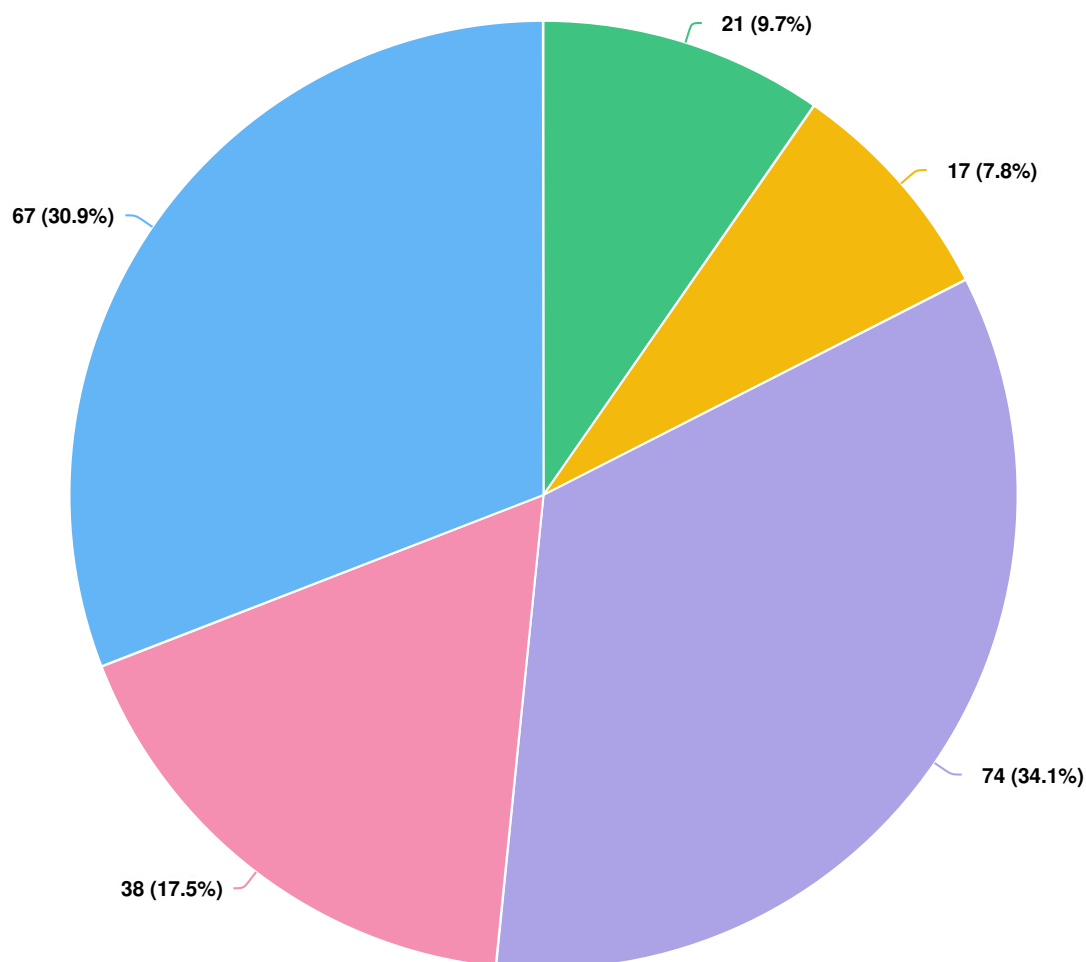

It's also more time consuming to have to travel to these sites and a short appointment could turn into a half day off work which isn't always easy or possible - and costly too. As there's no clear commitment to which 'other local sites' would provide physio or what % of the service and type of care (thinking about physio that needs equipment) would or could be provided eg in GP surgeries so I will assume that may not materialise or be very limited) Why can't physio be provided at Westbourne Green too? That would be an improvement, Or at some of the larger GP premises in Shipley or Baildon or even Bingley - but with a clear commitment to this a plan for it and a published level of service there.

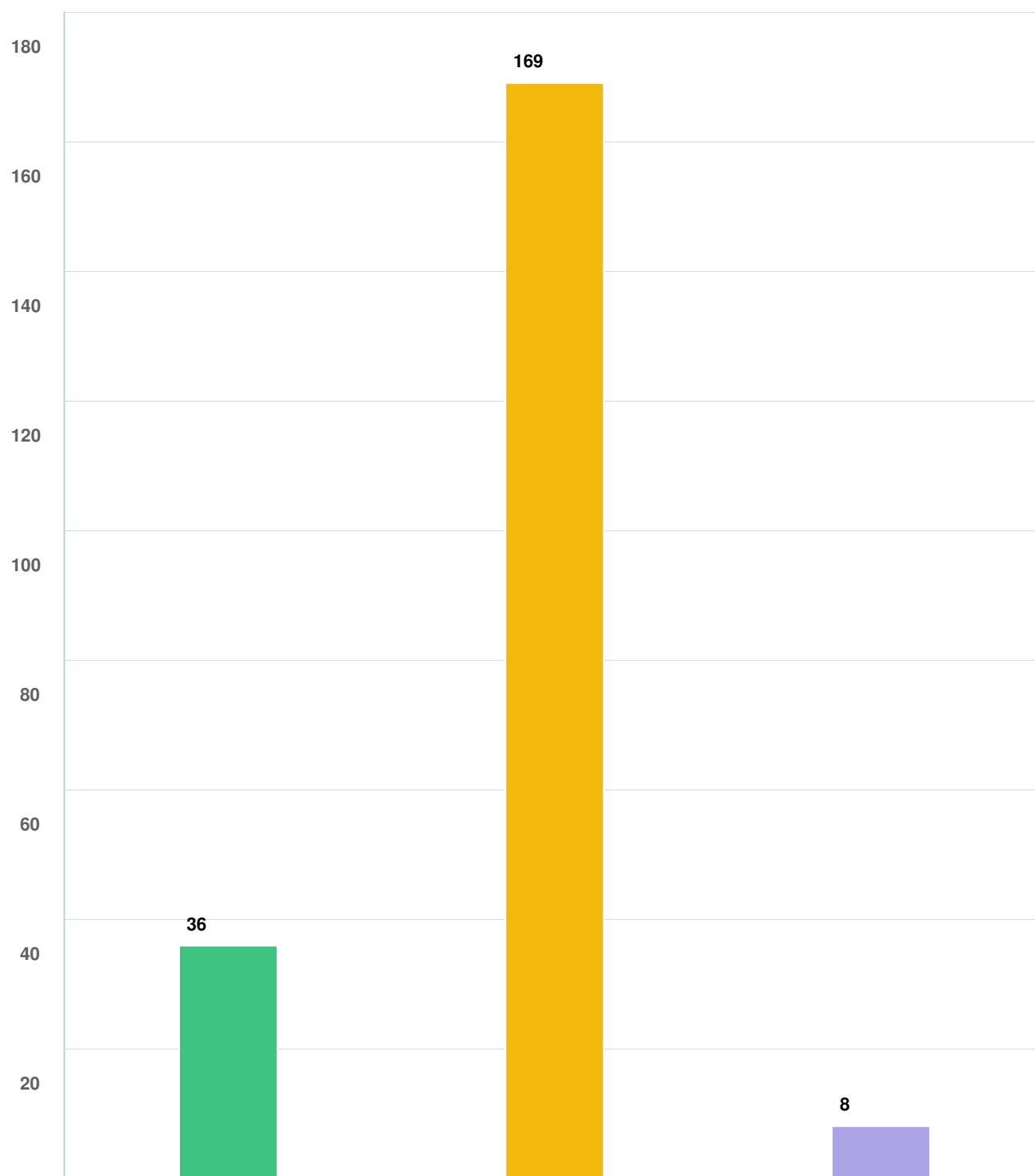

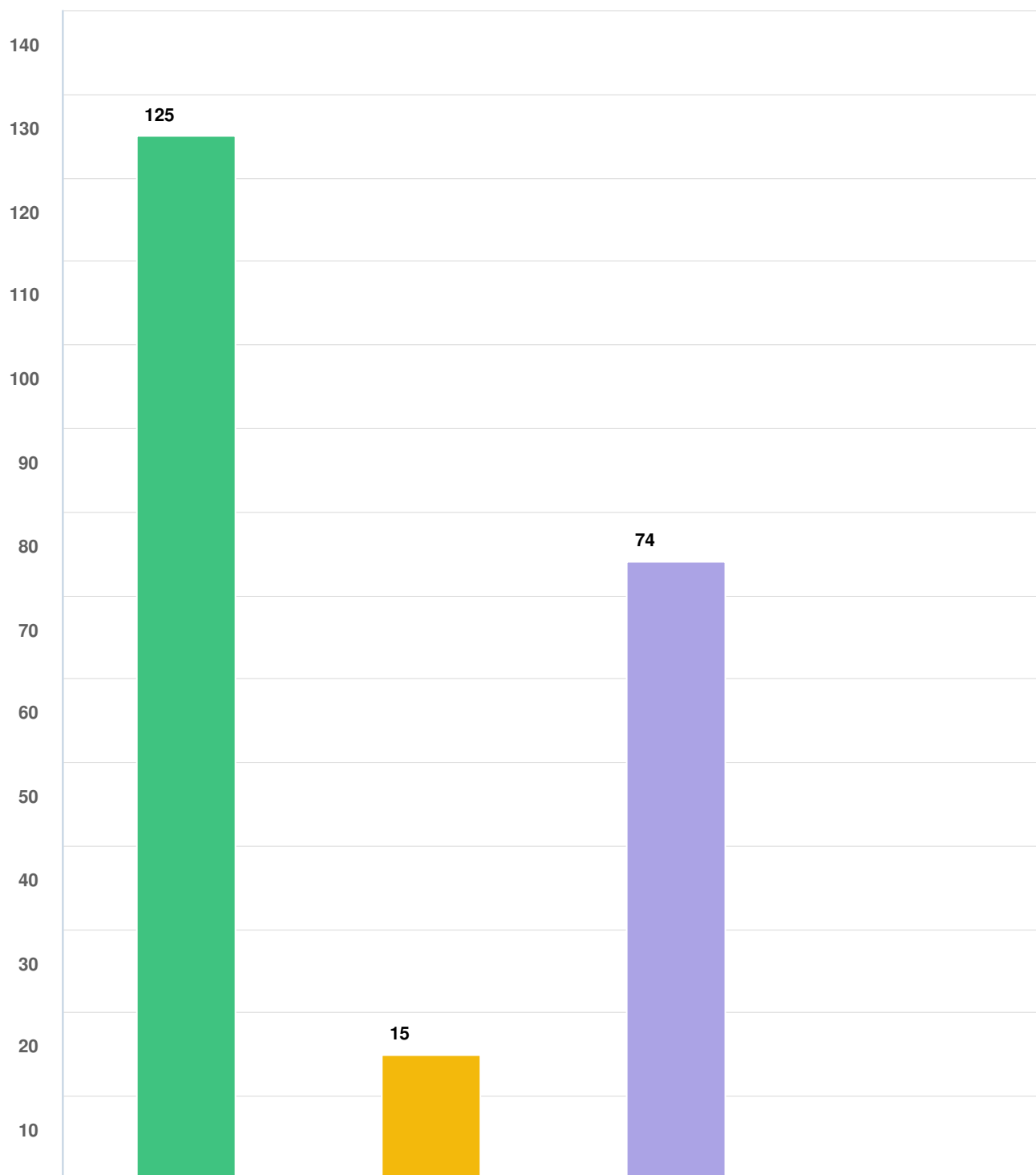
