Background and Key Issues

BTHFT is at the forefront of the use of digital technology to support the provision of safe, high quality efficient and effective care. It increasingly uses data intelligence and insight gleaned, for our key clinical and operational systems, to inform best practice, focus resources – both human and financial, and prioritise operationally and strategically. We progressively add additional functionality to our clinical systems to support the delivery of priority work programmes – the Virtual Royal Infirmary, Virtual Wards, Theatres Anaesthetics and Critical Care - and overhaul and upgrade our infrastructure to be safe (cyber), resilient and responsive to user requirements. We invest in the required capacity and capability to increase our overall digital maturity to support the transformation of clinical workflows and pathways, identify and reduce unwarranted variation, and enable our patients and communities to take a more proactive role in care, self-management and navigating through the health and care system. We work with partner organisations at Place, including Airedale NHS Foundation Trust explicitly, across WYAAT, particularly with Calderdale and Huddersfield NHS Foundation Trust, and with partners in the ICS, regionally and nationally. This annual report summarises the progress we have made over the last 12 months and previews some of the developments and initiatives we plan to introduce in the year ahead.
